# State Economic Funds Deliver Downtown Development

Business, community, and arts will converge to provide continued momentum for Auburn's downtown revitalization. The Plaza of the Arts is a result of seed money from the 2012 NYS Consolidated Funding Application overseen by the CNY Regional Economic Development Council.

The anchor of the new endeavor is the relocation and consolidation of a local development company's east coast headquarters. Dan Soules and Mark Dunn are partners of Soules and Dunn the company behind Auburn's latest development effort. Their company operates chains such as Arby's, Tim Horton's, and Domino's Pizza. The central operations of the company's headquarters will set up shop in Auburn, relocating from Roanoke, Va. bringing dozens of professional jobs to the downtown scene. The company is also the training facilitator for all east coast Arby's and the new space will be their training headquarters, bringing hundreds of employees through Auburn for 30 day training stints providing an added element to the economic impact the project will have on Auburn.

For Dan Soules making the decision to relocate to Auburn came due to the positive investment and development Auburn has seen in recent years. Addressing a recent community roundtable Soules stated "This whole process was dreamt up about 2.5 years ago. We would drive through downtown Auburn and see the changes and feel the excitement in the city. We felt it was our time to do something. With the theaters, the activities, the arts, and the fellowship we have downtown it really will allow us to grow."



The project also includes retail space which will feature a restaurant row and public event space. The local popular Downtown Deli will establish a new additional presence in the downtown scene, as well as, a bakery-coffee shop concept and other mixed retail. The public event space will be focused on providing the community with one additional venue for community and artist offerings.

Jennifer Haines is the City of Auburn's Director of Planning and Economic Development; she reports that the state funding was combined with incentives such as a PILOT Agreement, Sales Tax Exemption and Mortgage Tax Exemption made available by the Auburn Industrial Development Authority (AIDA).

Auburn's Mayor Michael Quill commented on how the project came together. "With support from the State of New York and AIDA we were able to effectively channel these economic development funds into a local project that will have an immediate and dramatic impact for Auburn. Thanks to the investment made by Soules and Dunn Auburn will see an influx of jobs and new business that will deliver a significant economic ripple effect throughout the community."

# NYCOM LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACHIEVEMENT AWARD FOR PANGO

he Pango pay-by-phone parking initiative which was launched last year in Downtown Auburn has received recognition from the New York Conference of Mayors (NYCOM). The City of Auburn received a Local Government Achievement Award for cities with population below 50,000 from NYCOM for its successful implementation of the innovative parking program.

The award was presented to Auburn's Mayor Michael Quill and City Manager Doug Selby at the NYCOM annual conference in Saratoga Springs.

"This is great recognition for Downtown Auburn and all of those responsible for implementing the Pango parking project," said Auburn's Mayor Michael Quill.

According to Auburn's City Manager Doug Selby the Auburn City Council approved implementing Pango in the spring of 2013 and during its first year of operation the system has generated over 1,000 users. "Thanks to the city staff that worked on the implementation of the program and to the Auburn Downtown Business Improvement District (BID), which has done a lot to support and promote the program," said Selby.

Auburn is Pango's first research and



development city in Upstate NY. Pango Mobile Parking gives patrons a smarter and easier way to pay and park in Downtown Auburn. No longer will people have to look for change, deal with walking to pay parking meters and kiosks, or worry about getting a parking ticket.

Downtown Auburn BID Director Connie Reilley shared, "It is important that people understand that this option is in addition to what is available now, those who want to use it will enjoy the added convenience, and those that don't, do not need to worry about using something new."

City Manager Doug Selby said, "By offering a pay-by-phone option the City of Auburn takes a significant step forward in making parking more convenient for residents and visitors. Pango is an important element of the City's continuing effort to use technology to improve City services."

Following a simple registration for the Pango service, you can use your mobile phone to pay for parking wherever you see the Pango signs. The program is now in 47 cities nationwide. # A NEW DIRECTION IN ELDER CARE FOR CAYUGA COUNTY

ayuga County, Loretto, Mercy Health Rehabilitation Center and the Sisters of St. Francis have been working collaboratively for some time to evaluate the needs of the aging population in Cayuga County. As a result of this collaboration, a decision was made to combine the strengths of Mercy Health and Rehabilitation and the Cayuga County Nursing Home into a consolidated 300 bed facility in the City of Auburn. The project was made possible with a NYS HEAL Grant.

The Commons on St. Anthony, formerly Mercy Health and Rehabilitation, has been in operation since 1972. The Commons on County House Road, formerly the Cayuga County Nursing Home, has been in operation since 1984. The two facilities have merged and are now owned and operated by Loretto as Auburn Senior Services, Inc.

The Commons on St. Anthony is undergoing a complete renovation and construction of a new addition and will become the sole site of the next generation of skilled nursing and rehabilitation care. Currently, the Commons on St. Anthony concentrates on long term skilled nursing care and The Commons on County House Road specializes on short term rehabilitation.

The Commons on St. Anthony offers a specialized unit for elders with dementias. This secured unit

promotes independence and safety with a wander alert system. Therapeutic and recreational programs are designed for cognitive stimulation and memory enhancement.

Recreational therapy activities on other units vary based on the abilities of the elders, but all of our rehabilitation activities are stimulating, fun-filled and geared towards wellness and independence.

The Commons on St. Anthony is also the site of a 50 person Adult Medical Day Program named Daybreak on St. Anthony. Program participants ages 18 and up are provided with the medical and supportive services they need to maintain their highest level of independence while continuing to live in the community.

The combined facilities provide the most comprehensive, state of the art elder care services in Cayuga County. "This is a good path for continued long term care in our region" said Michael Chapman, Cayuga County Legislature.

Commenting on the magnitude of this collaborative effort, Loretto President and CEO, Kim Townsend said, "Cayuga County is all about community. Everyone at the table has had the best interests of the community in mind. The goal was to create a plan that would best serve the elders in this county, both today and in the future; to essentially change the face of elder care forever."




